Overview. The course aims to discuss the major existing approaches to non-finite clausal complementation, focusing on the problem of the nature of embedded subjects. Considering and comparing data from English and other languages, we will talk about such topics as the notion of finiteness, raising vs. control, null categories, PRO, and DP / PRO distribution.

Students are expected to have some prior knowledge on clause structure, IP / CP. In preparation for the course students are encouraged to go through Basic English Syntax with Exercises (Newson et al. 2006), Ch. 6, Ch. 7.

Requirements. Attendance plus occasional short in-class quizes plus a final in-class quiz.
