Reflexive Pronouns and Reflexivity

Instructor

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Overview. In this course we will discuss reflexive strategies attested in the world's languages focusing primarily on reflexive pronouns (cf. in English *John likes himself* vs *John likes him*). The course aims, on the one hand, to create a historical perspective and to go through seminal works on the topic. On the other hand, it emphasizes the importance of acknowledging complexity of the term reflexivity and pays attention to more recent papers about different manifestations of reflexivity in various languages, including the so-called reflexive voice.

The course assumes that students are somewhat familiar with basic syntactic notions as introduced in BESE (Mark Newson et al. *Basic English syntax with exercises*), such as *phrases (VPs, vP, NPs), arguments, predicates, thematic roles, syntactic functions (subject, object)*, although we will discuss them in more detail.

Requirements. Students are expected to write and present in class a short essay either commenting on a paper / papers discussed in class or presenting a set of relevant data from a language not considered in class and analyzing it using one of the discussed approaches.
