 $S \rightarrow NP VP$

 $NP \rightarrow Det N'$

 $VP \rightarrow Adv VP$

 $VP \rightarrow V NP$

 $N' \rightarrow AN'$

 $N' \rightarrow N$

N → dogs, cats, squirrels, neighbour, burglar

Det \rightarrow my, the, many, few

Adv → menacingly, surprisingly, obviously

 $A \rightarrow angry$, frightened, exhausted, alarmed

 $V \rightarrow$ chased, bit, terrified, provoked

Why are N' nodes needed (i.e. why are just NP and N insufficient)?
