1. Ask ten people to list as many examples of the category of MUSIC as they can. Write down the

examples in the order they were mentioned. Then try to see if different individuals mentioned the

same examples. If they did, check to see if you can find a correlation between the shared examples and

the order in which they were mentioned. What conclusions can you draw from this in light of what

you have learned so far in the course? (Your answer should be minimum 1 page long.)

2. A. Note that BIRD is only a basic-level category in urban societies, where - due to the changes in

human living conditions - some cognitive capacities (namely, the need for distinction between

different kinds of birds) have become underutilized. The same goes for the category of COFFEE,

which is a basic-level category in everyday language, but may be a superordinate-level one for people

who work in a café (to them, coffee has many subcategories according to various features: where the

coffee beans come from, how they were processed, and so on). Can you think of any other possible

examples of the underutilization of cognitive capacities that could result in a shift from superordinate-

level categories to basic-level categories? Make use of what you learned in the course so far to explain

the phenomenon.

B. Think of the opposite procedure, when experts as a result of their wider, more specific knowledge

use the names that denote subordinate levels as basic-level categories. For example, horse breeders

(for horses), surfers (for the curves of waves), architects (using house types), and so on. Can you think

of any other highly specialized subcultures in which a basic-level term in "mainstream" culture would

"only" be at the superordinate level? Make use of what you learned in the course so far to explain the

phenomenon. (For "A" and "B" together, your answer should be minimum 1 page long.)
