

Below is a [REDACTED] transcription of some Spanish words. [b]/[β], [d]/[ð], and [g]/[ɣ] are pairs of allophones whose members are in complementary distribution; that is, they occur in mutually exclusive (or nonoverlapping) phonetic environments. (See *Linguistics*, pp. 128–129.)

[β] is a voiced bilabial fricative.

[ð] is a voiced interdental fricative.

[ɣ] is a voiced dorsovelar fricative.
